Bray Town Council (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) in exercise of the powers vested in it by Section 36 of the Road Traffic Act 1994 and Section 101 of the Road Traffic Act 1961 and having consulted with the Commissioner of An Garda Síochána hereby makes the following Bye-Laws.

**PART I**  
**Preliminary**

- Citation:** 1. These Bye-Laws may be cited as the Bray Town Council (on street) Parking Control Bye-Laws, 2009.
- Commencement:** 2. These Bye-Laws shall come into operation on the 5<sup>th</sup> January 2009.
- Area of Application:** 3. These Bye-Laws apply to the area comprising of the administrative area of Bray Town Council.
- Interpretation:** 4. In these Bye-Laws:  
“**agent of the Council**” means any person employed by Bray Town Council or any other person authorised by the Council to carry out functions under these Bye-Laws;  
“**acceptable evidence**” means the following: -
- (a) a current insurance certificate which indicates that the vehicle in respect of which the resident’s parking permit has been applied for is normally kept at the resident’s address in the residential parking permit area to which the permit relates;
  - (b) a vehicle licensing certificate, registration book confirming that the resident applying for a resident’s parking permit is the registered owner of the vehicle in respect of which the application for a resident’s parking permit is being made and that the vehicle is registered at the resident’s address in the residential parking permit zone to which the permit will relate and
  - (c) current utility bills, financial statements, tenancy agreement or other documentation, acceptable to the Council, addressed to the resident at his/her address on the public road which relates to the parking permit;
  - (d) At any stage prior to the expiry of a resident’s parking permit the Council may request the person to whom a permit was issued to produce ‘acceptable evidence’ to satisfy the Council that they were entitled to be issued with the permit. Any such request will be made in writing to the person to whom the permit was issued at the address given by that person on the application form;

(e) In the event of 'acceptable evidence' not being produced to the Council within one month from the date of the written request the Council may, at its discretion, deem the resident's parking permit to be invalid and cancel the permit without further notice.

**"authorised person"** has the meaning assigned to it by Section 103 (8) of the Road Traffic Act 1961 (as inserted by the Road Traffic Act, 1968);

**"buffer area"** means an area between two pay parking places;

**"disabled persons parking permit"** means a permit granted in accordance with Article 43 of the Regulations of 1997 and 1998;

**"dwelling"** means a building or structure designed and used for residential purposes, other than an apartment within a purpose built apartment block;

**"goods vehicle"** means a vehicle used exclusively for the carriage of goods or burden in the course of trade or business and taxed as a goods vehicle;

**"information plate"** means a plate accompanying a traffic sign, which indicates the period during which the restrictions or prohibition indicated by such traffic sign applies;

**"loading bay"** means that portion of a road indicated by means of a traffic sign No. RRM 009 on which a vehicle, other than a goods vehicle being used for loading or unloading, shall not be parked during a period which shall be indicated on an information plate;

**"normal dwelling place"** means the housing unit where a person either lives and resides, or satisfies the Council that he/she intends to live and reside, overnight for more than 183 days per year;

**"operational hours"** means the periods 07.00 to 19.00 from Monday to Saturday inclusive except where otherwise indicated on an information plate accompanying traffic Sign No. RUS018 authorised by the Signs Regulations of 1997 in the ticket parking area where the vehicle is parked, of operation indicated on the appropriate parking ticket machine, or the appropriate information plate;

**"parking fee"** means a fee prescribed for the pay parking place in which the vehicle is parked;

**“parking permit”** means a resident’s parking permit or visitors parking permit issued by the Council or its agents for the purposes of Bye-Law Nos. 15 to 29 and containing the particulars specified in Bye-Law No. 15 and 26;

**“ticket vending machine”** means a ticket dispensing machine (pay and display meters) which is capable of automatically issuing a pay and display parking ticket when the appropriate parking fee provided by these Bye-Laws is inserted into the machine;

**“pay and display parking ticket”** means a parking document which is issued by the Town Council by means of a parking ticket vending machine and which contains the particulars: -

- (a) The words “Bray Town Council”;
- (b) The fee paid in respect of the ticket;
- (c) The date and time of issue of the ticket;
- (d) The time of expiry of the ticket;
- (e) The pay parking area where the pay and display parking ticket is valid;

**“pay parking area”** means a Restricted Parking area in the town, which contains parking places subject to a fee;

**“pay parking place”** means a place, space or bay for the parking of a vehicle in a pay parking area on a public road intended for the parking of mechanically propelled vehicles and where traffic sign number RUS 018 and any one of the following roadway markings RRM 011, RRM 012, RRM 013 or RRM 014 of the Signs Regulations are provided.

**“public road”** means a road over which a public right of way exists and the responsibility for the maintenance of which lies with the road authority;

**“resident”** means a person who is the occupant of a dwelling, other than a purpose built apartment block, who satisfies the Council that his/her normal dwelling place is at premises situated within a pay parking area which relates to the parking permit;

**“resident’s parking permit”** means a document issued by the Council or its agents for the purposes of Bye-Laws 15 to 25 and containing the particulars specified in Bye-Law 15;

**“residential parking permit area”** means a pay parking place on a public road where traffic sign No RUS 018 together with an accompanying information plate indicates that parking of vehicles is

subject to the exhibition of a pay and display parking ticket or a residents parking permit;

**“road”** has the meaning assigned to it by section 2(1) of the Road Act, 1993;

**“special parking permit”** means a special parking permit issued by the Town Council, its agents or authorised officers only containing the particulars in Bye-Law No. 26.

**“the Regulations of 1997 and 1998”** means

- (i) the Road Traffic (Signs) Regulations, 1997 (S.I. 181 of 1997);
- (ii) the Road Traffic (Traffic and Parking) Regulations 1997 (S.I. 182 of 1997);
- (iii) the Road Traffic (Traffic and Parking) (Amendment) Regulations 1998 (S.I. 274 of 1998);
- (iv) the Road Traffic (Traffic and Parking) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations 1998 (S.I. 441 of 1998);
- (v) Road as per Roads Act 1993 S(2).

**“the Road Traffic Acts”** means the Road Traffic Act 1961 to 2006;

**“the Road Traffic Regulations”** refers to regulations made under the Road Traffic Acts;

**“traffic warden”** has the meaning assigned to it by Section 2 of the Local Authorities (Traffic Wardens) Act, 1975, as amended;

**“valid coins”** means the coins indicated on the appropriate Pay and Display machine;

**“valid pay and display parking ticket”** means a pay and display parking ticket which has not expired, which is valid in the pay parking place in which the vehicle is parked and which is displayed in accordance with Bye-Law 9;

**“vehicle”** means: -

- (a) a passenger vehicle with passenger accommodation for not more than eight persons excluding the driver and not drawing a trailer or other vehicle;
- (b) a goods vehicle whose unladen weight does not exceed three tonnes and not drawing a trailer or other vehicle;

**Repeals:**

- 5. Subject to Bye-Law 37, the Bray Town Council Traffic and Parking Bye Laws 1997 are hereby repealed.

**PART II**  
**Pay and Display Ticket Parking**

**Parking in pay  
and display  
parking places:**

6. The following provisions shall apply during operational hours to parking of a vehicle in a pay parking place.-
- (a) subject to paragraph (b) of this Bye-Law, a vehicle which is parked in a pay parking place during operational hours shall, where parking bays are provided at that pay parking place, be parked within the delineated parking bay;
  - (b) a vehicle which had been parked in a pay parking place for the maximum period permitted in that pay parking place, as indicated on the appropriate information plate, shall not be parked again in a pay parking place on the public road in which that pay parking place is situated until at least one hour has elapsed since the vehicle was last parked in that pay parking place.
  - (c) a vehicle shall not be parked in a buffer area;
  - (d) a person shall not park or cause to be parked in a pay parking place a vehicle in such a position that it, or any portion of it, extends from one parking place to another;
  - (e) a person shall not overhaul or carry out repairs to a vehicle while it is parked in a pay parking place, save where it is necessary in order to enable the vehicle to be removed from the pay parking place;
  - (f) a vehicle, while parked in a pay parking place, shall not be used for the sale of goods in or from the vehicle or as an office; nor shall any such vehicle be offered or displayed for sale or for hire or as a prize. A person shall not make any unnecessary noise by means of, or in relation to, a vehicle while it is parked in a pay parking place, or by means of any equipment, fitting or instruments fitted to or carried on the vehicle or any loud speaker or radio in anyway connected to the vehicle.

**Vehicles which  
may be parked in a  
pay parking place:**

7. Mechanically propelled vehicles only, of the following classes, may be parked in a pay parking place during operational hours: -
- (a) a passenger vehicle with passenger accommodation for not more than eight persons excluding the driver and not drawing a trailer or other vehicle;
  - (b) a goods vehicle whose unladen weight does not exceed 3 tonnes and not drawing a trailer or other vehicle;



**Motorcycles and pedal cycles prohibited from parking in pay and display ticket parking places:**

8. A motorcycle, with or without a sidecar, or a pedal cycle shall not be parked during operational hours in a ticket parking place.

**Obligation to display a valid parking ticket:**

9. (a) A valid pay and display parking ticket, parking permit, or disabled persons parking permit must be displayed as specified in this Bye-Law in the interior of a vehicle lawfully parked in a pay parking place during operational hours;
- (b) The valid pay and display parking ticket, parking permit, or disabled parking permit shall be displayed on the front dashboard of the vehicle or inside the front window of the vehicle so that a person outside the vehicle looking at/through the front window can see the ticket or permit and ascertain when the parking ticket/permit ceased or will cease to be valid;
- (c) The Pay and Display parking ticket, parking permit, or disabled card shall be exhibited in accordance with paragraph (b) of this Bye-Law for so long as the vehicle is parked in that pay parking place.

**Appropriate parking fees and minimum payment:**

10. (a) The fees payable are shown on the appropriate parking ticket machine, and as set out in Appendix 1 of these Bye-Laws, as may be amended;
- (b) A pay and display parking ticket shall be purchased from an appropriate pay and display parking ticket vending machine;
- (c) The payment fee for a pay and display parking ticket shall be payable by means of any combination of valid coins, or, where the facility is provided, by payment card or by mobile phone payment. The method/methods of payment will be indicated on the pay and display parking ticket vending machine;
- (d) The valid pay and display parking ticket shall be displayed immediately on parking provided that, where a vehicle is parked at a time not during operational hours, the valid pay and display parking ticket shall be displayed in accordance with Bye-Law 9 at the commencement of operational hours;

**Period of parking in ticket parking place:**

11. A vehicle parked in a ticket-parking place during operational hours shall not be so parked for a period longer than the maximum period for which parking is permitted on that day in that pay parking place as indicated on the information plate located on the public road in which the vehicle is parked or located on an adjacent public road, where indicated by a sign;

**Suspension of paid parking controls on specified days:**

12. Paid parking controls shall not apply in any pay parking place on National & Public Bank Holidays;

**Interference:**

13. (a) No person shall insert any coin, article, or object, other than the coins specified, for the purchase of a pay and display parking ticket in a parking ticket vending machine, or interfere in any other way with a parking ticket vending machine;
- (b) No person other than an agent of the Council, a member of An Garda Síochána, an authorised person or a traffic warden shall interfere in any way with a hood, sign or other device placed on a parking ticket machine;
- (c) Where a vehicle is parked in a pay parking place on a day and during a period which is indicated on an information plate a person shall not interfere with, alter or deface a valid pay and display parking ticket or parking permit exhibited in the vehicle;
- (d) An agent of the Council, authorised officer or traffic warden shall not be interfered with in any way while performing his/her duties under these Bye-Laws.

**Non-compliance with Bye-Laws:**

14. Any person in breach of these Bye-Laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be subject to a fine as prescribed by the Road Traffic Acts and the Road Traffic Regulations.

**PART III**

**Parking Permits For Residents**

**Particulars on parking permit:**

15. A valid residents parking permit shall contain the following particulars: -
- (a) the words '*Bray Town Council*';
- (b) the make, model and registration number of the vehicle in respect of which it is issued;
- (c) the pay parking street to which it relates;
- (d) the date of expiry;
- (e) the signature of the person issuing it.

**Number of parking permits to be issued:**

16. In any one year, the Council shall, on application by a resident, issue one parking permit per resident's car within its own pay parking area, subject to production of acceptable evidence by the resident, and to roadspace criteria, up to an upper limit of four residents parking permits per dwelling.

Number of permits per household are dependent on metres of road frontage and space within the curtilage of the dwelling.

| <b>Issue of replacement parking permit:</b>                                  | <b>21.</b> | Where evidence is submitted that a resident's parking permit has been lost, destroyed or stolen the Council or its agents shall issue a replacement to the owner on payment of a fee as indicated in Appendix II, as may be amended, subject to production of acceptable evidence by the owner and such replacement permit shall be substituted for the original permit and the original permit shall be void.  |
| <b>Return of parking permit:</b>   | <b>22.</b> | Where, during the period to which a parking permit relates, the holder ceases to reside within the pay parking area to which the parking permit relates, or ceases to be an owner by disposing of the vehicle to which the permit relates, he/she shall return forthwith the parking permit to the Council or its agents, and such permit shall be void.  |
| <b>Transfer of parking permit:</b>   | <b>23.</b> | If the holder of a parking permit for a vehicle replaces that vehicle with another, he/she shall be entitled, following the surrender of the original parking permit, to receive a parking permit, subject to production of   |

acceptable evidence in respect of the new vehicle, which shall be valid up to the expiry date of the original parking permit.

- Display of a void parking permit:** 24. It shall be an offence to display a void or expired parking permit.
- Falsified documents:** 25. Where a resident or applicant submits falsified documentation to support his/her application for a resident's parking permit or for a visitors parking permit/permits the Council may, at its absolute discretion, decide not to issue a resident's parking permit or a visitor parking permit/permits to that applicant/resident.

#### **PART IV Special Parking Permits**

- Particulars on special parking permit:** 26. A special-parking permit shall contain the following particulars: -  
(a) the words '*Bray Town Council*'  
(b) the words '*special parking permit*', and  
(c) the address to which it relates;  
(d) the date of expiry;  
(e) the signature of the person issuing it;
- Display of valid special parking permit:** 27. The display, in accordance with Bye-Law 9, of a valid special parking permit on a vehicle, shall permit the person using it to park in a pay parking area on a public road to which it relates.
- Issue of, and fee for special parking permit:** 28. (a) Special parking permits may be issued by the Council or its agents to residents, subject to production of acceptable evidence, in a pay parking area in respect of the parking of vehicles which are not normally kept in that area and which require to be parked temporarily in a pay parking place in that area;  
(b) The fee for each special-parking permit shall be as indicated in Appendix II, as may be amended;  
(c) A special-parking permit shall only be valid for use in the pay parking area on a public road to which the specials permit relates.
- Disposal of special parking permit:** 29. It shall be an offence for a resident to sell or otherwise dispose of a special permit to a person other than a special as defined in these Bye-Laws.

**PART V**  
**Permission For Non-Operation Of**  
**Parking Ticket Machine(s) And/Or Pay parking place(s)**

- Application:** 30. Application for permission for the non-operation of a parking ticket machine(s) or a pay parking place(s) must be made in writing for the following:
- (a) placement of a skip;
  - (b) placement of a cherry picker;
  - (c) placement of a crane;
  - (d) placement of vehicle over 3 tonnes;
  - (e) filming purposes and/or associated vehicles;
  - (f) utilities works and/or vehicles;
  - (g) opening of access to the public road; and
  - (h) any other circumstances at the discretion of Bray Town Council.
- Conditions of permission:** 31. The permission, if granted, shall be subject to any conditions which will be specified in writing by the Council, including the payment of a fee/fees by the person requesting the permission.
- Appropriate fees:** 32. The appropriate fees payable for permission shall be as agreed in the particular circumstances.
- Issue of Permission:** 33. The permission, if granted, will issue in writing together with notification to the appropriate enforcement agency of the details of the permission.
- Breach of Condition:** 34. It shall be an offence to breach a condition specified in writing in the permission.

**PART VI**  
**Miscellaneous**

- Non-application of Bye-Laws:** 35. Bye-Law 9 of these Bye-Laws shall not apply to: -
- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the removal of an obstruction to traffic, the removal of a vehicle pursuant to Section 97 of the Road Traffic Act, 1961, as amended, the immobilisation and release of vehicles, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of a public road, the provision, alteration or repair of a main drain, sewer, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, oil, water or electricity or of a telephone line or the provision of a traffic sign;
  - (b) a fire brigade vehicle, an ambulance or a vehicle being used by a traffic warden, an authorised person or a member of An Garda

Síochána or the Defence Forces in the performance of his/her duties;

- (c) where a vehicle being parked in a pay parking place during business hours is a goods vehicle parked while goods are being actively loaded in or on to it or unloaded from it, Bye-Law 9 shall not apply until the expiration of 30 minutes after the commencement of the parking.

**Disclaimer:**

- 36. In accordance with Section 36(13) of the Road Traffic Act, 1994, the performance by the Town Council or its agents of their functions under these Bye-Laws shall not render the Council subject to any liability in respect of loss of or damage to any vehicle in a parking place or the contents of such vehicle.

**Continuity of repealed Bye-Laws and Transitional Provisions:**

- 37. (a) Nothing in Bye-Law 5 shall affect the validity of anything done under the 1997 Bye-Laws. Any actions taken under the 1997 Bye-Laws or any other thing done shall not be invalidated by any repeal of the said Bye-Laws but shall, if in force immediately before the said repeal was effected, have effect as if made or done under the 1997 Bye-Laws unless otherwise provided;
- (b) The continuity of the operation of the law relating to matters provided for in the repealed 1997 Bye-Laws shall not be affected by the substitution of these Bye-Laws for the said 1997 Bye-Laws and
  - (i) so much of any other Bye-Law, act or document as refers, whether expressly or by implication, to, or to things done or falling to be done under or for the purposes of, any provision of these Bye-Laws, shall, if and so far as the nature of the subject matter of the other Bye-Law, act or document permits, be construed as including, in relation to the times, years or periods, circumstances or purposes in relation to which the corresponding provision in the repealed 1997 Bye-Laws has or had effect, a reference to, or, as the case may be, things done or falling to be done under or for the purposes of, that corresponding provision;
  - (ii) so much of any other Bye-Law, act or document (whether repealed, passed or made after the commencement of these Bye-Laws) as refers, whether expressly or by implication, to, or to things done or falling to be done under or for the purposes of, any provision of these Bye-Laws, shall, if and so far as the nature of the subject matter of the other Bye-Law, act or document permits, be construed as including, in relation to the times, years or periods, circumstances or purposes in relation to which the corresponding provision in the repealed 1997 Bye-

Laws has or had effect, a reference to, or, as the case may be, things done or falling to be done under or for the purposes of, that corresponding provision.
