

2. Notice of Motion in the Name of Councillor Dermot O'Brien (05/10/20)

"That this Municipal District write to the Court Service and Department of Justice outlining our support in principle that the old Bray Courthouse on the Boghall Rd be transferred into Community ownership and that a process be initiated to explore how this can be done as soon as possible."

Response: Following a request from Chief Executive it is proposed to seek plans and prepare a brief description of facilities and condition of the building to forward to the CCSD Directorate to work with Bray MD.

3. Notice of Motion in the Name of Councillor Dermot O'Brien (05/10/20)

"That this Municipal District explores the development of a model of public consultation that ensures the inclusion of relevant stakeholders in any decision making process relating to Council activity that will impact on them. The model would aim to enhance public engagement and transparency but also provide clarity on decision making processes."

Response: Where a project is being progressed by a Local Authority Planning Permission is applied for under Part 8 of the P & D Regulations. There is a statutory consultation period for this process. The WCC website also has a Consultation Hub and this site will inform citizens of projects and allow online submissions.

4. Notice of Motion in the Name of Councillor Joe Behan (06/10/20)

That this Municipal District constructs pedestrian signal at Springfield burial ground/Killarney Road.

Response: An assessment for the provision of a controlled pedestrian crossing facility was carried out last year. It concluded that the existing traffic managed/calmed crossing is the most appropriate facility for the current conditions and that no further consideration of changes is warranted. However, a scheme is being designed for the upgrade of cycle facilities along the Killarney Road. This will impact on the layout of the roadway at Springfield, in which case a review of the most appropriate facility may be necessary. The cycle scheme will also provide an opportunity to address the complexities presented by the position of the existing bus bays and the vehicular access at the cemetery and thereby improve the perception of the crossing points. This would be particularly important if the type of crossing were to change to a facility that transfers precedence to the pedestrian.

5. Notice of Motion in the Name of Councillor Joe Behan (06/10/20)

That this Municipal District installs car charging points in Kilmacanoge new car park opposite St. Mochonog's Church.

Response: Proposals for electric vehicle charging points at Herbert Road, Enniskerry and Kilmacanog car parks have been forwarded to Roads and Environment Sections for their attention.

6. Notice of Motion in the Name of Councillor Joe Behan (06/10/20)

That this Municipal District erects the directional sign for St Mochohog's N.S as agreed previously.

Response: Kilmacanogue National School was recently contacted and arrangements have been agreed for the provision of a new sign.

7. Notice of Motion in the Name of Councillor Joe Behan (06/10/20)

That this Municipal District writes to Iarnród Éireann regarding the ongoing noise nuisance from recharging of DART train batteries.

Response: The matter has been referred to the Pollution Control Section for their attention. They have received no other complaints about noise. On a related matter a Noise Management Plan dealing with essential repair works at the sidings in Bray is being reviewed.

8. Notice of Motion in the Name of Councillor Joe Behan (06/10/20)

That this Municipal District recommences suction sweeping of all housing estates in Bray, Kilmacanogue, Enniskerry on a rota basis.

Response: Suction sweeping is scheduled according to need and to the maximum extent that resources permit. There will be a step up in the use of suction sweeping services at this time of year due to leaf fall.
